Our u3a continues to flourish and we have approaching 1,000 members. I would like to thank all the Group Leaders and Trip Organisers who make our u3a what it is. Any new members who have an idea for an interest Group should contact our Groups Coordinator, Jenny Schofield, who will be happy to give them advice and guidance. Once again thank you for your support it has been a pleasure to serve you all.

Committee decisions: - at our recent Committee meeting it was agreed that: -

- Members should note that the u3a Insurance only covers up to a maximum of 10 day trips a year (and does not include insurance for holidays). That means that no one should go ahead with any coach bookings before consulting Jenny Schofield the Groups Co-ordinator

- The Last Coffee morning for this year will be 16th December and the first one for next year will be 6th January 2026

Staying in Touch

Our new website, weston.u3asite.uk is intended to be the principal way we communicate with our members. It has information about trips, groups, lectures and other information, such as Committee Meeting Minutes and links to other websites, including the National u3a newsletter.

We send out an update email on the first Sunday of the month with links (underlined in blue) to the website, so you can keep up to date about what's happening in your u3a.

Coffee Mornings

We hold a Members' coffee morning every Tuesday in the Friends' Meeting House (FMH) at the corner of High Street and Oxford Street, from 10am -11.15am.

There is a ramp at the rear of the FMH for those unable to use the front steps. There are displays of trips, committee meeting minutes and other information, as well as facilities for new members to join.

Emails to Members

To save on costs of production and distribution we use emails to contact members about groups, events and trips, to send the invitations to attend the AGM and the associated AGM papers. If you have an email address you will only receive this Newsletter in electronic form via a link sent to you in an email. Paper copies can be collected, if required, at a Coffee Morning.

Currently, there are 67 members out of our total of 921 who have not given us an email address. Those members only receive information about the u3a by attending Coffee Mornings and from these Newsletters that are published three times a year. Of course, they may be accessing the website for information but if they have no email address it is unlikely that they are accessing the internet to find our website. If you know someone who is a member and doesn't have access to email, consider buddying up to keep them informed.

If you don't want emails from u3a, please do not mark them as SPAM as Internet providers may begin to believe all emails sent from us are spam, preventing us from communicating with the whole membership. If you would rather not receive emails from us, use the link to unsubscribe (which every email we send should contain), but be aware that you will miss important announcements unless you regularly check the website or attend Coffee Mornings.

Personal Data

The data the u3a holds about members and how it is managed are described in our Data Protection and Privacy Policies as detailed in Principle 4 below.

Principle 4 – Personal data held should be accurate and, where necessary, kept up to date; every reasonable step must be taken to ensure that personal data that are inaccurate, having regard to the purposes for which they are processed, are erased or rectified without delay.

In order that the data held is up to date the online membership renewal process provides an opportunity for members to inform the u3a as to any changes in their personal information. Members who have registered to use the Members Portal can check and amend their data at any time through the portal.

Those who do not renew online or have not registered to use the portal are asked to inform the Membership Secretary of any changes. From time to time, you will be sent a copy of the data we hold so that you can check that it is accurate and up to date.

MONTHLY LECTURES (Shirley Harvey – Lecturer Co-ordinator)

Talks are held on the second Friday of each month (except August) in the United Reformed Church Hall in Waterloo Street, W-s-M - starting at 2.15pm, with doors open from 1.50pm. Admission is **now £3.00**, which covers Hall hire and refreshments are available after the talk. Non-members are very welcome.

Recent speakers have talked about the British Honours system and how they are put forward, approved and awarded - by Mr Ash Jones, MBE.

We've also been informed about aeroplanes and airports from which we travel - by Baz Hamblin.

The Coach trip to Abergavenny and Hereford in April was the first U3a trip that I'd organised with the advice of our seasoned trip organiser, Jenny Schofield.

Fifty plus of us left Weston on a lovely, sunny day and had a smooth hour's journey to Abergavenny. Abergavenny is an attractive walled town in Wales containing the remains of a medieval stone castle. Most of us headed for the wonderful market after a reviving cup of coffee. There was both an indoor and a huge outdoor market with a wide variety of stalls such as locally made produce, antiques, arts and crafts, and clothes. There was a massive plant stall outside and a huge meat van with a very funny trader offering meat at reasonable prices. I for one, would take a cool box next time to buy meat and some plants to bring back in the coach's luggage hold. Some people had the forethought to do just this. Our helpful coach driver, Martin, even offered to put any meat purchases into the coach's cool box. There was also a good selection of independent shops as well as the usual chains in Abergavenny.

At lunchtime we moved on to Hereford for the afternoon which was about half an hour's drive away. Some of us set off for the Cathedral, others went shopping and a few headed straight to Wetherspoons, not naming any names. The Cathedral is very impressive with beautiful stained glass including some modern pieces and there is a small charge to visit the *Chained Library* and *Mappa Mundi*. There's also a lovely café. Hereford also has a good variety of shops including the ever-popular Marks and Spencer.

We arrived back in Weston at about 6.30pm after a good day out. It was a successful first trip from my point of view with happy passengers, a good driver, sunny weather and no hold ups so I'm happy to arrange my second trip later this year and hope it works out so well.
